Senior Services for South Sound was established in 1972 as a multi-service, non-profit agency serving the elders of Mason and Thurston Counties. The agency is governed by a volunteer Board of Directors, who are representatives from our service area. Eighty-nine percent of funds raised by Senior Services for South Sound go to services for Seniors

Our Mission

To celebrate life in partnership with seniors and their families and to support their ability to remain independent in the community.

Our Other Services

Services to At-Risk Seniors (STARS) Adult Day Care Centers offer supervised day programs for frail elders. Time provides respite for family caregivers.

Social Services

A program that supports seniors with Support Groups, Senior Companionship, Phone Friends, assistance with resources & referrals and families consultations.

The Senior Center Activities

program provide educational classes, recreational programs and trips for area seniors. The planned activities focus on health promotion and social interaction.

South Sound Care Connection

A program to support families coping with long term care issues by providing the important link between screened caregivers and families in crisis. This program provides Alzheimer's care consultations and private care management for seniors unable to qualify for Medicaid.

Transportation Program

This volunteer based program is designed to provide transportation for individuals over the age of 60 living in rural South Thurston County, including Rochester, Tenino, Bucoda and outlying areas. Transportation is available for medical appointments, senior nutrition programs and essential errands.

Meals-On-Wheels

People who are confined to their homes and are over 60 years of age, may be eligible for home-delivered meals.

Up to 1 meal per day may be provided - either fresh or frozen depending on locale and distance from serving site. All weekend and holiday meals are frozen.

Those who qualify may help support the program by voluntary donations. The recommended amount is \$2.50 per meal.

People who do not qualify may still receive home delivered meals by paying the full price—at present (2010) \$6.12 per meal.

Meals meet 1/3 of the Department of Agriculture's Required Daily Allowance. They are low in sodium. Special dietary accommodations may be taken into account.

Waiting list may be in effect for qualified clients.

Senior Nutrition has a Registered Dietician on staff who is available for group and individual consultation. To arrange for an in-home consultation call (360) 586-6181 Ext 112
