





Activity Levels

We are including a guide corresponding to the ease or difficulty of a trip. The symbol appears in the trip write-up, to better help you choose your travel:

-  Easy, minimal walking, primarily flat Surfaces
-  Moderate, leisurely walking over mostly level ground. Some standing, uneven surfaces, a few stairs
-  Brisk walking, standing, uneven surfaces, with a few stairs likely.
-  More Difficult. Walking or standing, uneven surfaces, possibly flights of stairs.

Participants with limitations should take this into consideration.

Winter Cancellations

Non-Refundable

Late cancellations, ticketed events, casino trips and gift certificates are non-refundable.
